

OIL PAINTING CLASS SUPPLY LIST

Brushes: Filberts #'s 10, 8, 6, 4, and 2. I like American Painter brand, LONG HANDLES. Make sure they are OIL brushes, whatever brand you choose.

Palette knife and very small painting knife

A Canvas Paper tablet. This is great for class work, although you can use stretched canvas or canvas boards if you prefer.

Paper towels (very absorbent ones), and plastic grocery bag for trash

Palette: 16 X 20 disposable paper one is fine, or a wooden one. Please do not try to use a small one; you will frustrate yourself to death!

Paint: Buy a beginner set to start if you want, with at least 10-12 colors. Here is a list of what I use: Cadmium Yellow Lt.

Cadmium Red Lt.

Alizarin Crimson

French Ultramarine Blue

Cobalt Blue

Cerulean Blue (optional)

Permanent Green Lt.

Sap Green

Ivory Black or Paines Gray

Yellow Ochre

Burnt Sienna

Burnt Umber

Titanium White

Odorless Turpentine, and Turpenoid Natural (OIL) and 2 small metal cups to put them into at class. Try to find the ones with lids on.

Glass jar with lid for cleaning brushes. Jelly jar size is good.

"Liquin" for OILS. This is a medium I sometimes use if the paint seems too thick. Also is a drying agent.

Retouch Varnish spray (you will eventually want this)

Last but not least: A tote or basket to carry all this in.!!
